



OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT - FOR IMMEDIATE ENACTMENT

A LAW

For the purpose of regulating the operation of private military corporations within the Amissopian Federation

ARTICLE I

- 1) For the purposes of this Law, the terms “private military company”, “private military corporation”, “security contractor supplier”, and “organisation of private military contractors” are used interchangeably and refer to businesses operational within the Amissopian Federation, the primary purpose of which is the provision of armed combat or security services for private financial gain.
- 2) For the purposes of this Law, “Amissopian military officials” refers to any officials involved in the operation or day-to-day activities of the Amissopian military.
- 3) For the purposes of this Law, “the field”, unless specified otherwise, refers to an active area of operations in which the Amissopian military is engaged.
- 4) For the purposes of this Law, the “Amissopian Federation” refers to:
 - a. The legal territories of the Amissopian Federation as enumerated by law;
 - b. Territory under Amissopian military or civil occupation.

ARTICLE II

- 1) The Minister for Homeland Security shall be responsible for, by statutory instrument, drafting and publishing an Amissopian Military Code which shall be binding on all Amissopian military officials, detailing:
 - a. An Amissopian phonetic alphabet for use in the field;
 - b. A code base for describing specific incidents in the field;
 - c. Rules for conduct of military officials in the field.
- 2) The Minister for Homeland Security may update the Amissopian Military Code at their discretion.
- 3) Private military companies may not operate within the Amissopian Federation except where:
 - a. They are approved by the Minister for Homeland Security or an official to whom the responsibility is delegated by them;
 - b. They agree to be bound by the Amissopian Military Code as enumerated in II.1 of this Law, and all subsequent drafts thereof;
 - c. They agree to be bound by all relevant treaties and international laws with jurisdiction in the area of operation in which they will be engaged.
- 4) The Minister for Homeland Security may withdraw approval for the operation of certain private military companies at their discretion if they have reasonable belief that the private military company is violating its responsibilities pursuant to II.3 or other relevant Amissopian or international law.
- 5) The Minister for Homeland Security may request from any private military corporation documents or other files or items of interest within their possession relevant to a Homeland Security investigation pertaining to their continued compliance with the agreement enumerated in II.3 of this Law, provided reasonable probable cause is established.
- 6) The Federal Criminal Code of the Amissopian Federation shall be amended as follows:



- a. Section IV: "Crimes against the State" shall be amended to have a new Section 15, pushing all subsequent sections forward, which shall read as follows:
 - i. "It shall be a criminal offence for either a) any individual affiliated with a private military corporation as defined in the Private Military Corporations Law or b) any private military corporation as defined in the Private Military Corporations Law to deliberately undertake to violate the provisions of the agreement enumerated in II.3 of the Private Military Corporations Law empowering them to operate within Amissopian jurisdiction. This offence may be referred to in short hand as "violation of private military corporation regulations"."
- b. Section IV: "Crimes against the State" shall be amended to have a new Section 16, pushing all subsequent sections forward, which shall read as follows:
 - i. "It shall be a criminal offence for any individual employed by any branch of the Amissopian military to fail to comply with the provisions of the Amissopian Military Code as written by the Minister for Homeland Security. This offence may be referred to in short hand as "violation of military code"."

ARTICLE III

1. This law shall take effect upon presidential signature.
2. This law shall affect the entire Federation.
3. This law may be referred to in short hand as the Private Military Corporation Law.
